Nominees must be:

- at least sixteen years of age;
- actual communicants;
- on the Electoral Roll of this Parish

Proposers and seconders must be:

- on the Electoral Roll of this Parish

No person shall be nominated unless he has signified his consent to serve, or there is in the opinion of the meeting sufficient evidence thereof. No person shall be nominated if he is disqualified from serving by the bishop under section 10(6) of the Incumbents (Vacation of Benefices) Measure 1977 and 1993, or if he is disqualified from being a charity trustee under the Charities Act 1993. No person shall be nominated, chosen or elected to serve if they are included in a barred list (within the meaning of the Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act 2006) or has been convicted of an offence under section 10(6) of the Incumbent (Vacation of Benefice Measure 1997.

Note: A person is disqualified from being a charity trustee under the Charities Act if they have been convicted of an offence involving deception or dishonesty (unless any such conviction is legally regarded as spent), if they are an undischarged bankrupt, have made compositions or arrangements with any creditors from which they have not been discharged or have been removed from serving as a charity trustee, or been stopped from acting in a management position within a charity.
